## *Start- and End Stitch*

### *Starting Stitch (Start-st)*

A start-st is the first st you make when you do a knitted cast-on. It could be a new slip-knot on a needle or any loop you pick up anywhere in your knitting.

### *End Stitch (End-st)*

The very last st (end-st) of a Domino figure can be done in different ways, here are listed the 4 ways I use and which are referred to in my instructions:

**End-st 1:** When you continue knitting a new square in the same color: Do not BO the end-st, but use it as the 1<sup>st</sup> st of the next square and continue with the same yarn.

**End-st 2:** When you continue knitting a new square in a different color: Do not BO the end-st, but use it as the 1<sup>st</sup> st of the next square and k-darn the tail as you continue.

**End-st 3:** When the project or the square is finished by the end-st, break the yarn pull it through the st, but leave it loose. This is called a loose end-st which is used when you work panels.

**End-st 4:** When the project or the square is finished and not to be continued in any way, the end-st is BO and the tail is darned.
